This year, the communities we work with are being hit the hardest.

The families we work with in the Mission and the Bayview are experiencing some of the highest incidences of COVID-19, with rising food and housing insecurity, little access to resources, and traumatic economic fallout. From unprecedented job losses to the threat of eviction, this was a year where fear took hold and would not let go.

When we think about hope, we think about all the Good Samaritan families who rely on sacrifice and love to make it through each day.

Since 2020, our community has experienced the full assault of COVID-19. Thousands of our families plunged into crisis – with high infection, hospitalization, death rates, and unprecedented economic fallout.

Together, we answered the call to help vulnerable families and individuals meet their most basic needs. We started offering direct services to 3,400+ families: cash assistance, food boxes, counseling, diapers, and more. Uniting together, we see hope everywhere:


- Hope in our talented and dedicated staff

- **Provided essential in-person support** with learning hubs for 50 Bayview and Mission children
- **Implemented distance learning & virtual programming** for nearly 375 students and sustained after school programs and support groups



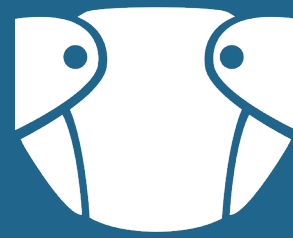

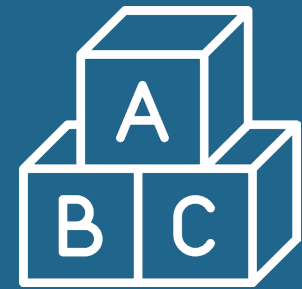

At Good Samaritan, we believe in meeting our community members where they are. When our Latino, Asian and Black neighbors were the hardest hit by the pandemic, we knew that familiar loving faces and resources would go a long way. We wanted to make sure our neighbors feel supported during a difficult time by assisting them in meeting some of their basic needs:

- Every Wednesday from 2020-2021, we distributed **100 free food boxes** to the Bayview and Mission communities.
- Every month, we distribute **diapers, gift cards, and hygiene bags** to families in Potrero Hill, Candlestick Park and the Bayview.

Our passionate staff and volunteers make sure every person is treated with dignity: from remembering their names to making sure they know we are here to help in any way we can.
